## Materials List

(Quilt kits are available for purchase $\rightarrow$ Go to http://www.susanbanthonyhouseshop.org and search "Quilt Block")
Colors should be sunflower yellow, purple, and white. These were three of the traditional suffrage colors.
Central Design Square
White: cut $141 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. (With $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances, it will finish at $14^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ )
Backing Block
Muslin: cut $201 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. (With $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances, it will finish at $20^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ )
Sashing strips - (kits will contain $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips)
2 - Yellow strips - Approximately $3 \frac{1122^{\prime \prime}}{} \times 141_{2 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ and $311^{\prime \prime} \times 171_{2 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ (Will finish at $3^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ and $3^{\prime \prime} \times 17^{\prime \prime}$ )
2 - Purple strips - Approximately $31_{2}^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 1712^{\prime \prime}$ and $31_{2}^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 2012^{\prime \prime}$ (Will finish at $3^{\prime \prime} \times 17^{\prime \prime}$ and $3^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ )
4-3/8" grosgrain Yellow ribbon $-11^{\prime \prime}$ length each
$4-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ grosgrain Purple ribbon $-11^{\prime \prime}$ length each

## Design Block Comments

1. Central Design can be drawn, painted, printed, pieced, appliqued, embroidered, etc.; anything that can be in the completed block and be folded in half (to $10^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ ) for storage and shipping without damage.
2. Use archival materials (e.g. archival pens if doing a drawing/lettering).
3. Batting is not necessary, nor recommended. Less bulk and weight is preferred to keep shipping and mailing costs lower. These blocks could be on the road for a number of years, and visit far flung areas of the country.

## Assembly Instructions

1. Press fabric if it has been folded in a kit package.
2. Compose design on a central $141 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square by either creating a block or putting a design with archival materials on central block.
3. Note - all seams should be $1 / 4$ inch.
4. Measure top of Central Design square and cut one yellow sashing strip to that length. (It should be about $141 / 2$ inches.) Place the yellow strip on top of design square - right sides together and edge of sashing strip aligned with the sides of the design square. Pin together and stitch seam of $1 / 4$ inch. Press both seam allowances toward the sashing.
5. Measure the length of newly created block (Design square plus one yellow sashing strip.) This should be about $17 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. Cut second yellow strip to length and place on the right side of the design block, right sides together, pin and stitch $1 / 4$ inch seam allowance. Press seam allowance toward sashing.
6. Follow the same process (measure, cut, pin, stitch, and press) as above to add a purple strip to the bottom of the block, followed by the last purple sashing strip to the left side of the block.
7. Place newly created block (design plus sashing) on a flat surface. Lay ribbons in the corners at an angle, following this precise layout-
a. Viewing the right side of the sashed block:
b. Purple ribbons should be at the top right and bottom left corners.
c. Yellow ribbons should be at the top left and bottom right of the block.
d. Allow a half inch of the ribbon to be seen beyond the edges. The bulk of the ribbon should be inside the block.
8. Place backing block on top of the sashed design block and ribbons. Pin to hold blocks and ribbons in place for sewing. Start sewing on the backing using $1 / 4$ " seam leaving about an eight inch opening at the bottom of the block.
9. Turn the block inside out, pushing out the corners. Use the ribbons to gently pull out the corners. Press the block and top stitch or hand stitch the opening at the bottom of the block.
10. Quilt at least enough to hold the front and back together.
11. Affix label - see submission form instructions.
